## FIRST WEDNESDAY CLUB - March Meeting

Pandora Kanion from Northamptonshire Age UK came to talk to The First Wednesday club about their work. She explained that working in conjunction with Age concern and Help the Aged, Age UK was there to act like a caring relative for those getting on in years who might not have any family close by.

They can help with advice on what allowances are available. Money management and a befriending service where regular telephone calls can be arranged to check on peoples well being or just a friendly chat.

Age UK also supply practical services, for a charge, such as gardening, cleaning, and toenail clipping for those who find it difficult to manage for themselves.

They run a Home Care Cleaning Service for older people which includes general housework, internal cleaning of windows, laundry, light local shopping, changing beds and ironing. Also, they have a handyperson service who can help with such things as fitting grab rails, replacing light bulbs, even assembling flat pack furniture, and much more.

So I set off to the Co-op in Woodford Halse in Jenny's old Ford Fusion. Half way down Barnettts Hill on its steepest and narrowest part, there was an almighty crashing sound and the car came to a violent stop!

On inspection, the front right hand wheel was pointing outwards at an angle of 45 deg. A car stopped behind me and a very kind couple from Eydon offered assistance. Now stupidly, I had not got my phone or waterproof with me. So they kindly phoned Woodford Garage for me and I spoke to reception and explained my predicament. The breakdown truck was out on another job, but it would be with me in 15/20 minutes. By this time, traffic was building up on the hill and only small vehicles could get past. The couple from Eydon kindly let me shelter in their car until the breakdown truck arrived.

After about 20 minutes, the breakdown truck duly arrived and Robert managed to reverse it so that it could back up to the Fusion. Trying to winch the car on proved a bit tricky with the front wheel at 45deg and the tyre ramming up against the bodywork! However, after awhile they managed to winch the car on and then set off back to the garage.

The garage had had the presence of mind to send a van at the same time which picked me up and took me home to collect our other car. Always have two vehicles for such events!

On arrival at the garage, the Fusion was being lifted off the breakdown truck and within five minutes the damage was assessed and the parts noted for repair. Reception said they would phone me with a price before going ahead with the repairs. After half an hour the price was received and I told them to go ahead as it would be cheaper than a new car!

To my astonishment, at 4.30pm that same day Woodford Garage delivered the car to our house all completely repaired. Is that amazing service or what? So, Broken Britain ? no, you can still get fantastic service if you know where to go!

# Meet the People of Eydon Suzanne Smith



## What did you do, or what do you do for a living?

Horses and racing have always been in my blood. I left home at 17 to work in a racing yard in Wales where I was head girl for a couple of seasons. I also rode point-to-point, training a few horses including homebreds with my dad and riding out for local trainers, and then I worked for John Upson a national hunt trainer from Highfields, Adstone. I hung up my racing boots when I fell pregnant with my daughter Polly though racing never really leaves you.

These days I am Housekeeping Manager at Crockwell Farm wedding venue which keeps me very busy. During the quieter winter months I used to ride out for Ben Case — six mornings a week, three or four lots a day. That came to an abrupt halt about two and a half years ago when I had a rather nasty fall. I was on a hack, completely relaxed in a string of about seven horses, when the young mare I was riding spooked, I lost my balance and she planted me. I landed on my feet but went over on my ankle and fractured it and damaged the ligaments and tendon so badly I needed reconstruction surgery. It was the most undramatic fall imaginable — you gallop racehorses and they turn themselves inside out and you stay on, then they trip over a stone and you break your leg. That's just horses.

I also run Eydon's Pantry, my own small catering company. I prepare home-cooked meals, family favourites like lasagne, Fish pie etc. It started with filling people's dishes and giving them back ready to heat but mostly I supply Crockwell Wedding parties the night before their weddings now but if you're ever stuck for something for guests you know where to come!

## What are your hobbies?

Open water swimming is my absolute favourite thing. There's nothing quite like swimming in a lake or river. I go to Box End near Bedford and also to Bare Hill Lakes near Badby, where you book a session online and simply swim in a beautiful lake. Yes, it's cold, but once you get going you warm up quickly and the locations are just lovely. I swim for about half an hour to 45 minutes at a time. I keep meaning to drag a few people along with me. Maybe we can start a group!

I'm also a member of Eydon Players and sing in 'Cool for Cats'. We've done a couple of gigs at the pub and the village hall. And I've just started doing Murder Mystery dinners with a company called Invitation to Murder. My very first performance was last Friday at a hotel near Rutland Water. The play was called Fatal Vows and Cold Feet — a wedding scenario where the inspector storms in mid-ceremony to announce there's been a murder. The audience then questions the cast between courses. I absolutely loved it. It's all about pushing yourself out of your comfort zone and trying new things.

And of course there are my horses. I ride Tom our coloured warmblood cross — he was Polly's horse, bought when she was 14 and he's been with us ten years. He's done all the Pony Club, eventing, arena eventing. My dogs are equally important to me. Animals are everything.

## Have you always lived in this area?

I was born in Haversham a village near Wolverton and grew up there until I was nine when my parents separated. My two sisters stayed with Mum and I went with Dad — we were simply cut from the same cloth, both utterly horse-mad. We moved to a smallholding in Dodford, and that was where I really grew up, surrounded by horses and animals. At 17 I went to Wales for a season and a half in a point-to-point yard, and at 19 I bought my first house in Morton Pinkney. Life took me to Everdon for a while, and then I bought a house on my own in Woodford Halse, where I met my husband Ian. We had our daughter Polly before we mar-

ried — I always say you wouldn't buy a car without test driving it first! We've been married 23 years, so it was clearly the right decision.

We moved to Blacksmith's Lane in the village in 2002 with a six-month-old baby, buying a very dilapidated house from an elderly gentleman. Ian is a builder, so everyone thought we were mad but he knew what he was taking on. We lived there for 18 years before embarking on our current project: a beautiful barn conversion in a field we bought with nothing but hope and planning permission as a dream. It took two and a half years to get Class Q planning, and when someone complained partway through the build and the enforcement officers arrived, we ended up having to go for full planning — which actually turned out to be a better result. Whoever you are, thank you!

## If you could have dinner with three people, dead or alive, who would they be?

Mary Berry, without question — I just love her. David Attenborough, because he would fascinate me or every single moment he was talking. And one of the Princes in the Tower, because I am absolutely gripped by that story and the War of the Roses, and I would love to finally know what happened. History fascinates me — I love Warwick Castle, old houses, all of it. I think that would be a very good dinner.

## What three items would you take to a desert island?

A radio, because I love music. A barbecue, to cook on. And my animals — and probably my husband too, if we're being honest.

## Describe yourself in one word.

Armadillo. crunchy on the outside, soft and chewy on the inside. Everyone who knows me well calls me that — I can come across as quite fierce, but I'm really not, once you get to know me. Mostly!

Fry up. Obviously.

## Who would play you in a movie about your life

## What have been some of the happiest moments in your life?

My wedding day and the births of my children go without saying. But I would also say the day we moved into this house. Ian grew up in an ex council house along the road and I came from a family that separated early — neither of us ever inherited anything or had a leg up. We built this place from nothing, took risks, put everything on the line, had sleepless nights wondering if we'd completely lost our minds. And now I look out of my window and see my horses in the field, and I think — we made this happen. That means everything.

## Who has been the biggest influence on your life?

My dad. We are very alike. He lived in Ireland for 25 years, always follows his heart, lives above his means and goes and does exactly what he wants and thinks about it later. His attitude has always been: don't settle for something that isn't enough. Keep going until you get what you want. If someone says you can't have it, that just makes you want it more. He had his first point-to-point ride at 42. We trained horses together. They weren't world-beaters and neither were we, but we did it.

And then there's Ian. He works incredibly hard, he's an exceptional builder, and he just lets me be me. I want to do pantomime, murder mysteries, open water swimming, ride horses — and he always says, let's work out how to make it happen. We recently went to the Caravan and Motorhome Show to look at motorhomes, thinking it might be nice to travel with the dogs after his mum passed away last year. We bought one on the spot. It arrives tomorrow and we have absolutely no idea where we're going first. That's us, really.

## Tell us something people don't know about you.

I won a talent competition at Butlin's holiday camp when I was seven years old, singing Stanley the Stork. I think that tells you everything you need to know.

This year my cycling objective is to complete the first half of the Tour de France as part of an event called Le Loop.

Le Loop is now a primary source of funds for the charity, raising between £300,000 and £500,000 a year.

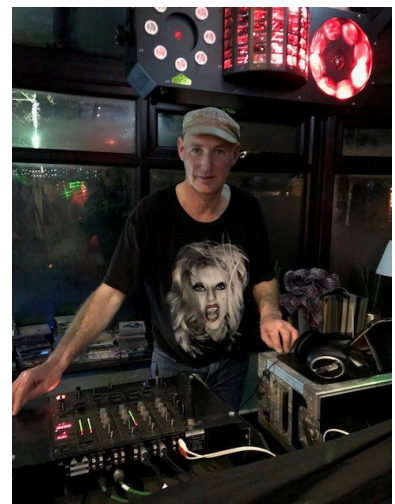
